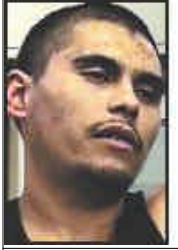
Crack Suspect To Cops: 'I Do Heroin'

Christopher Caldwell told Bernalillo County Sheriff's deputies there was no possible way the crack rock officers found in his car could be his, according to court records. "I do heroin," Caldwell said, according to a criminal complaint. Monday's incident started innocently enough. According to the complaint: Caldwell's car was sputtering after running out of gas near Goff and Sunset SW. Deputies who were patrolling the area noticed the disabled vehicle and got behind it to help Caldwell. Deputies also ran his license plate and discovered it did not match the vehicle.

After searching his vehicle, one of the deputies found the rock of crack cocaine. He asked Caldwell if it belonged to him; Caldwell denied it was his and said he is a heroin user.

Caldwell, 24, was booked into the Metropolitan Detention Center, where he remained late Tuesday on a felony drug possession charge, jail records show. His bond was set at \$2,500 cash or surety.
